If your English Accuplacer™ score recommends either ENGL 0900 or ESL 0900, consider taking your ENGL/ESL course along with one of these transfer level courses. Most transfer level classes have an “advisory” that suggests students be enrolled in ENGL 1000. Enrolling in *these* transfer level classes, **with the ENGL or ESL 0900 sections listed**, means you are earning transferable credits to help you meet your educational goals!
